

Failure or Success?

For the vast majority of people to be in love is a great thing.

Yet for a tennis player it is a great failure! How do you define 'failure'? How do you define 'success'?

Easter is a period of time that challenges our definitions of 'failure' and 'success'. There is the triumphant entry into Jerusalem on what we now call Palm Sunday. A king comes in peace - riding on a donkey - and the vast crowds raise their voices in acclaim and honour. 'Success'?

That week there are a number of exchanges between that king and the established religious authorities. The latter challenge the king's authority for what he does and says. He always seems to refute their allegations, avoid their traps and is 'successful'! BUT the religious authorities start plotting how to get rid of this king: on a permanent basis! Will they be 'successful? Will the king's 'successes' turn out to be the cause of his ultimate 'failure'?

The king and his disciples share a 'successful' Passover meal. During this meal the king even introduces a few changes to the meal and its meaning. 'Success'? Yet these changes seem to speak of the ultimate 'failure' of this king!

Then there is the 'successful' betrayal of the king. Yet the betrayer hangs himself! 'Success'? 'Failure'? Now the religious authorities have their man! 'Success'? Through persuading the Roman Governor to yield to their requests the religious authorities 'succeed' in getting this king condemned to death. As for the king he suffers the horrendous 'failure' of being efficiently flogged and crucified by the Roman authorities stationed in Jerusalem.

As the king hangs on that cross outside the city wall at Calvary the 'successful' religious authorities mock him! 'Success' to the religious authorities! 'Failure' to the king!

BUT what's that he is saying? **"It is finished."** What is finished? His life? His suffering? His . . . mission?

The king dies! The religious authorities celebrate their 'success'. BUT what was that? The massive curtain in the temple separating the Holy of Holies from the rest of the temple has been torn from top to bottom. Who could get up that high to tear the curtain? Where's the sun gone? Is that an earthquake? What is happening? Is this 'success'?

The king is taken down, there has been no rioting, he is 'successfully' laid in a tomb, it is sealed, Roman soldiers are guarding it to prevent the king's follower stealing the body.

Phew!! That was a hard fought victory! But now let's toast our 'success'!

If the authorities had only realised what they had done, they would have choked on their toast! You see, after all that effort and commitment they had lost! They had 'failed'! The king had 'succeeded'! He came to 'save his people from their sins'. [Mtt. 1:21] That meant paying the penalty for their sins. That penalty was death. That meant crucifixion! He came to give his people the gift of God. That mission was completed by his death on the cross: "It is finished."

[Jn. 19:30]

'The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.' [Rom. 6:23]

'Failure'? 'Success'?
Ultimate and total 'success' goes to Jesus!

Oh by the way, on the third day, just to emphasis the point, God the Father raised God the Son back to life, by the power of God the Spirit!

You see God in Jesus the Christ came first and foremost to die not to rise. His victory was his death. His 'success' was his seeming 'failure'. The resurrection, glorious and reassuring as it is, was really just his lap of honour!!

May God bless you richly this Easter by filling you afresh, or perhaps for the first time, with the 'success' of his love!





Christian Aid Week: 'Every Last Drop'

Kenya

In February 2017, the Kenyan Government declared a national drought emergency. With 2.7 million people without enough food, the drought is said to be the worst in decades. Droughts are now more frequent and more intense due to the climate crisis. Without a reliable source of water, many communities are struggling to survive.

In Kitui county, eastern Kenya, 8 out of 10 people depend on rain to grow crops both for food and to earn a living. Without enough water, staple crops like maize and beans wither up and die. In the drought, people can't grow crops, which means they can't earn a living. Instead they go hungry. Drought forces people to walk further and further to collect water. This daily burden robs them of the chance to farm and grow food for their families. Elderly women and children are especially vulnerable on these dangerous journeys and can face robbery or even conflict as people battle over scarce resources. Cows, sheep and goats are becoming weaker and weaker in the drought and can't produce milk or be sold. People are struggling to cope. Lives are at risk.



Rose

Rose is 67. Every day, she battles to bring water home for her grandchildren because of prolonged drought. Drought and hunger are driving her to the brink. 'The drought has been severe,' she tells us. 'We have had three long months without water, and now we have to walk long distances. We are suffering.'

Drought is causing a hunger crisis. Crops wither and die. Rivers are bone dry. People are struggling to survive. Rose strives to provide for her grandchildren. She does all she can to give them happy childhoods, like the times she remembers when there was plenty of food. The sad truth is, it doesn't have to reach this breaking point.

There is an earth dam just minutes away from her home. It should be a lifeline. But many people in Kenya, just like Rose, are struggling to survive the drought. With such dire need, every last drop of water in the dam has dried up.

This is Rose's climate crisis. No matter how hard she battles against it, drought leaves her and her grandchildren hungry. The rains are due to come any day now. Rose and her community need our support to help prepare the dam to capture the water, so not a single drop is wasted. The bigger and better the dam, the more water they can capture.

With a dam full of water, Rose would be free from her long, painful journeys. She'd have time to grow fresh vegetables for her family to eat. And she could see her grandchildren grow up and live life in all its fullness.

Unfortunately due to the current crisis we are unable to hold our usual fundraising events for Christian Aid Week, but we encourage you to continue to show your support by donating directly.
